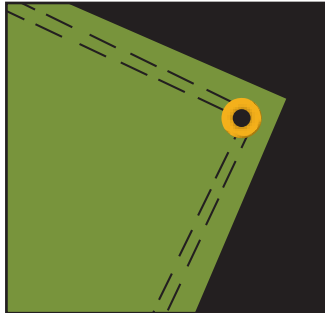


Banner Finishing Options

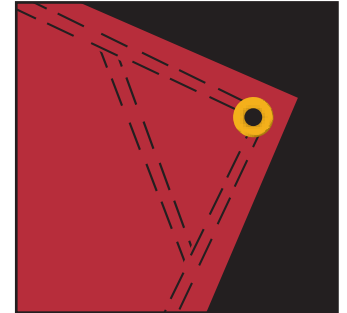
Grommets

Grommets provide a convenient method for attaching the banner to regular points. This distributes the banner's weight and helps keep the banner from sagging.



Hemmed Edges

Hemmed edges are used to reinforce the sides of vinyl banners, helping maintain the banner's shape and preventing stretching. This technique is used particularly with thicker banner materials that will not hold with only power tape.



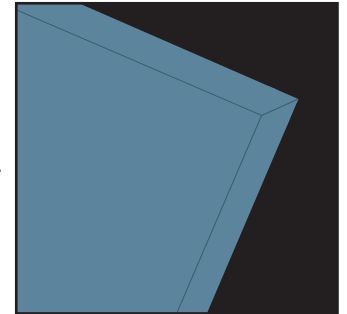
Pole Pockets

Pole pockets allow for rigid poles to be inserted along the edges of the banner. This allows for a more even distribution of the banner's weight to prevent sagging, especially if it will be hung for very long extended periods of time. Opposite pole pockets can also be used to make the banner more rigid.



Power Tape

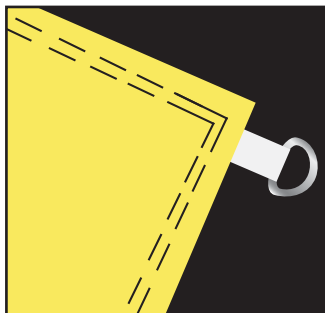
Reinforces the edges of shear cut banners or banners that have no material available for hemmed edges. A 1 inch border is cut around the banner to allow for space to place the power tape and fold over the edges. Corners are cut on a 2 inch diagonal line to create an evenly tapered edge for placement.



Additional Banner Finishing Options (Extra Time Required)

D-rings with Nylon Webbing

D-rings with nylon webbing are often sewn into large banners that will hang on buildings. The D-rings allow the banner to be secured with ratchet straps.



Nylon Webbing

Webbing sewn into the top and bottom makes the banner stronger and significantly extends banner life. Webbing is typically used in areas subjected to higher wind loads.
